Q. Four under, you finish at minus 18, good sand save at the last. I thought, you know, you birdied one and two and I thought that stretch, three, four and five, you had a good look for birdie at three, bogeyed four, and then a big tee shot at five, you couldn't make birdie there. That might have been a two- or three-shot swing and we'd be talking a little different story today.

BRIAN GAY: Yeah, absolutely. It was ideal birdieing the first two. A little too defensive -- well, had good opportunities on three and five, just bad speed there. Just a few too many mistakes. I still made a bunch of birdies. The course played a lot different, less wind and a different direction, so it was a bit trickier and a little bit more uncomfortable. Kind of get used to that same breeze all week and then it switches today. Good week nonetheless.

Q. I was going to say, four consecutive birdies down the stretch to get you back to where you finished.

BRIAN GAY: Yeah, I had some good shots, I had a couple really good putts I thought I made and it just didn't break. Then I hit 3-wood off 11 trying to keep it up top and it somehow went down there and end up making a bogey. Thought I played the hole perfectly. Got it going after that, tried to get back up there.

Q. You turned pro 25 years ago, you got four wins on the Tour, you're still grinding with these young guys out here. How does that feel?

BRIAN GAY: Yeah, it's good. You know, trying to hang with the young guns. Some of them are just barely old than my daughter. Still hanging around.
